This research paper states how a teacher's personality can be very crucial in the entire career of a student especially amid this post-covid period when the educational institutions opened after a prolonged period. The educational field greatly hampered during the covid-19 period. Though most of the organizations implemented on-line or virtual classes for the students, but it could not replace the physical class room situation. Hence, the study shows how a student can learn or influence by a teacher's personality by following him/her secretly. The teacher cannot be a neutral player in the class room. A teacher's position in relation to his/her students and the context in which they are is vital. 'Alchemy' is a chemical compound which can turn an ordinary material into a precious one. The findings of the study were significance. It shows that most of the teachers are aware about the impact of their personality on students and the teachers' attitude shape the students' career extensively.

All the educational institutions are shut down by the Government since 2019.
